Insights in Prevention

CCSA in Israel...

CCSA's provides developmentally appropriate prevention educational programming for our children. Since 2019, we have developed grade-specific presentations for 5th – 12th grades, with our 12th grade program focusing on the challenges our teens will face post-high school.

It was a natural progression for CCSA to expand into programming for our young adults studying in Israel for their gap year. On September 10th, in collaboration with YU in Israel, 25 staff members from 11 yeshivot and seminaries participated in CCSA's faculty training presented by Lianne Forman. Lianne discussed recognizing the early warning signs of substance use and addiction, focusing on the risks of alcohol and marijuana use, and related mental health concerns. She highlighted drug trends and availability of substances in Israel as well as effective strategies for intervention and support for students who are so far away from home.



In addition to those who came that day, we are already in discussion with a number of schools to come to their campuses for both student and faculty programming.

DO YOU KNOW THE **RISKS OF USING** NICOTINE?



CCSA Spotlight On... Cleveland

This upcoming school year will be the third year that CCSA will be presenting to the students of Fuchs Mizrachi School. Over the past two years, we met with their students in 8th, 10th, 11th & 12th grades. In addition, we spoke with faculty and parents, understanding the science behind addiction, current drug trends, and how to communicate with children about substances. We also discussed how to recognize if children/students are struggling with substance use or mental health challenges that might lead to use.

It has been a pleasure partnering with CCSA to educate our children and their parents about substance use" and misuse, and provide them with the latest research, information, and resources," shared Junior High Principal Rabbi Darren Levin. "We have found the presenters to be articulate, genuine, and engaging; they have offered a variety of perspectives and experiences, and their presence has been instrumental in helping students understand the potential consequences of substance use and inspiring them to make good choices. CCSA has brought more awareness, understanding, and knowledge regarding various challenges that our communities are facing, as well as the requisite tools and resources to both aim to preempt, and if not, treat them."

What Was CCSA Up To This Summer?

Although schools are not in session, we remained very busy, reviewing feedback from students, faculty, and our presenters about last year's programming. Using input from student questions, surveys, and focus groups, along with research into latest drug trends and statistics, we updated our prevention presentations and created new content for the upcoming school year. In addition, we:

- **Developed a new 5th Grade program,** focused on mental health and life skills, based on requests from our partner schools.
- **Expanded our team** of young Jewish people with lived experience in addiction, ensuring they are well-prepared to educate the next generation effectively.
- Revised our 11th Grade program based on feedback from focus groups with teens, we
 developed a new program to address specific challenges and mental health issues faced by
 this age group. We also created 6 videos which will be the springboard for interactive group
 discussions.
- Conducted a comprehensive analysis of the feedback collected from students over the past two years to provide data-driven insights into the issues affecting our teens.
